This can include revisions in grant application procedures and deadlines, award amounts, eligibility criteria, etc. USAID is not accountable for such changes. To ensure the information used is the most up-to-date, please refer to each individual grant maker's web page, and/or contact the organization for verbal confirmation.

How to Use this Matrix

Grant opportunities are divided into three broad categories: awards open to 1) both Organizations and Individuals, 2) Organizations, and 3) Individuals. Within each of these categories, opportunities are listed alphabetically by YALI track category: Business and Entrepreneurship; Public Management; and Civic Leadership.

Notes:

1. "Organizations" may include any of the following entities: central/local governments; municipalities; non-governmental organizations (NGOs); civil society organizations (CSOs); community-based organizations (CBOs); regional, sub-regional and sectoral organizations; private companies; universities; research institutions; etc.
2. Some grant opportunities are cross-referenced under one or more YALI track categories.

Description of Grant Making Organization

This column contains a brief description of the grant maker, as well as information on the grant itself. It tells which sector(s) the grant is under – i.e., public health, social innovation, entrepreneurship, information technology, environment, education, poverty reduction, human rights, and so on.

Link to Grant Opportunity

Internet hyperlinks are provided for the grant application, guidelines, FAQs, etc. (when available). Once you narrow down the grant opportunities that are of interest to you or your organization, be sure to click on the links in this column. They will be helpful in conducting research on the grant opportunity and grant making process.

Grant Amount

When available, the funding amount/range for a grant opportunity is provided. \$ = U.S.\$

Eligibility

This section indicates whether the opportunity is available to individuals, organizations or both. It also provides links to eligibility criteria for each grant opportunity (when available).

Point of contact

Before beginning to write a grant application, you are advised to contact the grant maker using

the phone and/or email listed. This will allow you to obtain information such as whether funding is still available, when applicable deadlines occur, and to confirm the process used by the grant maker for accepting applications

Geographic Eligibility

For planning purposes, this column specifies if the grant opportunity is open to global citizens, or specific to an African region or countries.

Tips on Writing a Successful Grant Proposal

A successful grant proposal is supported by clear project descriptions and realistic goals. It is well-prepared, thoughtfully planned, and concisely packaged. Because not everyone has access to a professional grant writer, and since this may be your first grant application, it is important to review the grant making organization's web site *thoroughly* in order to gain perspective on what their expectations are during the application process.

There are a number of resources available to help you write grant applications; in fact, some grant makers provide their own online tips for prospective grantees. It is highly recommended that you utilize any and all resources made available by the grant maker, including (but not limited to): Application Guidelines; Reporting Guidelines; Eligibility Criteria; Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs); and any other general information listed on 'how to apply.'

In addition to internal resources from grant makers, you should consider using other general resources to assist in the process of locating, researching, and applying for grant opportunities. Several are listed below:
